



#### **Crisis Management & Rebuilding Public Trust**

In January of 2019, Columbia Housing suddenly experienced an immediate erosion of public trust after the tragic loss of two of its residents due to carbon monoxide poisoning. The tragedy at the Allen Benedict public housing community in Columbia, South Carolina made national news and set off alarm bells throughout public housing circles around the country. What followed was barrage of bad press and publicly voiced concerns and questions about the safety and security of Columbia Housing's 16,000+ resident-populations. By March of 2019, several new members had been appointed to the Board of Commissioners, and six months later in July 2019, the new Board hired new leadership. Restoring public trust was paramount. Transforming an 85-year old public housing agency was no small undertaking, not the least during a year when it would face insurmountable challenges of a global pandemic. In responding to the public's concerns, the new leadership team immediately laid out a 12-month plan with four principles incorporated in transforming the culture of Columbia Housing. The principles include: 1) putting residents first, 2) increasing organizational efficiency, 3) creating a climate of transparency and accountability, and 4) rebuilding public trust. 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
